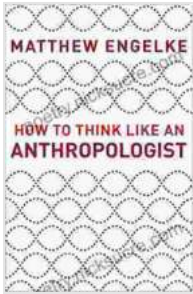

Respect for local customs means that anthropologists must be respectful of the local culture and customs. Avoiding harm means that anthropologists must not do anything that could harm participants in their research.

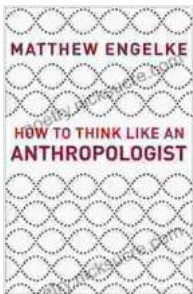

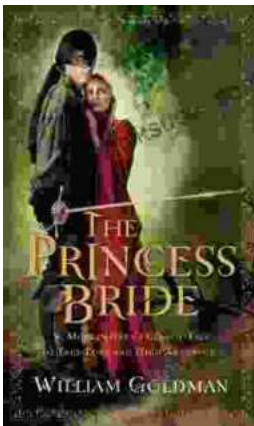
